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CONSTITUTION TEACHING IDEAS

- Give each member of the family a pocket Constitution (decorate it if you like)
- Patriotic Notebook for each child to use for notes, lessons, etc. (decorate if you like)
- Create spelling words from the Constitution
- Spiral Notebook for each person to copy the Constitution in its entirety (a little at a time), and also the Declaration of Independence. Eventually they will have the entire Constitution in their own handwriting (good handwriting practice).
- Keyboarding Practice from Constitution and Declaration of Independence
- Create a Constitution Table/Area (with small flag), with Constitution material, patriotic books, games, puzzles, workbooks, coloring pages, etc.
- Have "Patriotic Day" once a month (maybe on 4th) focus on liberty/Constitution, patriotic clothes, field trip, patriotic food, music, stories, websites, videos, etc.
- Memorize Preamble to the Constitution
- Article of the Day or Week (break-up in chunks)
- Amendment of the Day or Week
- Writing Prompts about Constitution
- Liberty Library Day: Everyone picks a patriotic book to read
- Recipe short parts of the Constitution (do in a whisper, accent, big voice, etc.)
- Constitution websites / virtual museums / patriotic videos
- Alphabetize Signers of the Constitution
- Constitution A-Z: Everyone flip through Constitution and take turns saying a word starting with letters in order of A-Z (do several times)
- Declaration of Independence A-Z: Everyone flip through the Declaration of Independence and take turns saying a word starting with letters in order of A-Z (do several times)
- Pick & Tell: Everyone pick a part of the Constitution (a sentence, paragraph, amendment, etc.),
 underline & take turns sharing and discussing
- Bill of Rights in Order (type & cut out shuffle & put in order
- Constitution Rhyme Time: Pick an Article or Amendment & read the first word aloud. Everyone comes up with rhymes for that word 'til out of rhymes, then go to next word (read as many as you want). Discuss meaning of what was read.
- Amendment Dice: Roll 2 dice & multiple. Read the Amendment that it equals and discuss it. If you roll a 1 on either dice, read Amendment ONE. Repetition will help to remember them.
- Patriotic Crafts
- Writing Practice: Names of Signers of Constitution & Declaration of Independence by State.
- Play patriotic music around the house and car
- Wear patriotic attire
- Attend liberty events
- Read patriotic stories & watch patriotic movies
- Remember to speak positively about America
